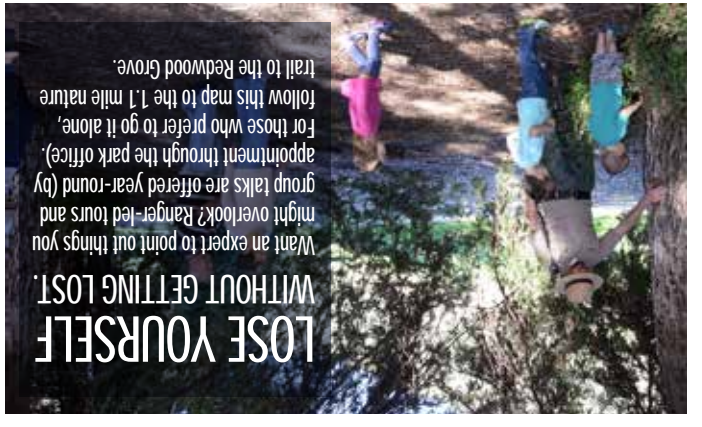

A BRIEF HISTORY.

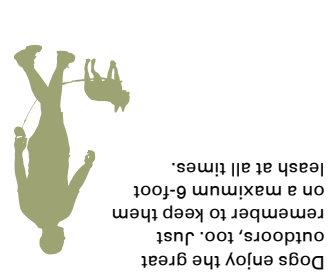
The land that is now Carbon Canyon Regional Park was settled in the early 19th century by farmers and ranchers, who established the village of Olanda in Carbon Canyon. Olanda boomed at the turn of the century with the discovery of oil in the area and thrived until the 1940s when the local oil fields began to shut down. It later merged with the nearby city of Randolph to form the city of Brea.

With the growth of Orange County after World War II, protection from flooding from the County's many creeks, including Carbon Canyon Creek, became a major concern. As a consequence, Carbon Canyon Dam was completed in 1961 by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. In 1974, 114 acres of land upstream from the dam was leased to the County by the Corps for the establishment of a regional park. The park was opened to the public the following year.



LOSE YOURSELF WITHOUT GETTING LOST.

Want an expert to point out things you might overlook? Ranger-led tours and group talks are offered year-round (by appointment through the park office). For those who prefer to go it alone, follow this map to the 1.1 mile nature trail to the Redwood Grove.

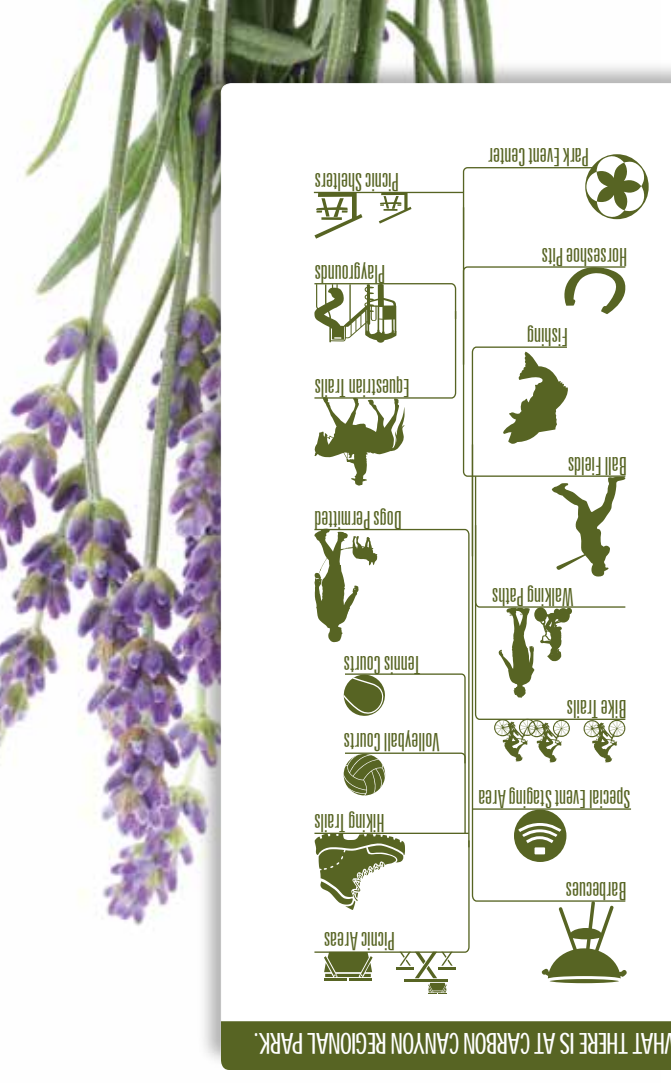
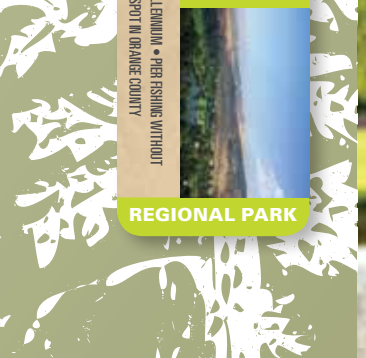
BRING YOUR POLE.

3 ACRES OF TREES THAT WILL SEE THE NEXT MILLENNIA • REBIRTHING WITHOUT 300 MILES TO THE BEACH • PICNIC IN THE BEST SPOT IN ORANGE COUNTY

Upstream of the Carbon Canyon Dam lies 124-acre Carbon Canyon Regional Park. Sixty acres are developed, offering large, grassy areas for picnicking, sports facilities that include backstops and lighted tennis courts, and a 4-acre lake with two piers for fishing. The undeveloped area features a trail that leads to Orange County's only grove of redwoods; 3 acres of majestic Coastal Redwoods.
