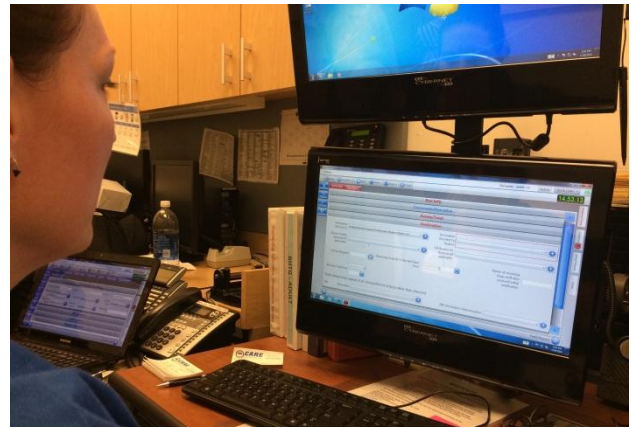


Who's "Going Live"?

Electronic Base Hospital Report (eBHR) Pilot Expanding

Orange County EMS has been working with local Base Hospitals to conceptualize and implement the technical infrastructure for a countywide electronic Base Hospital Report (eBHR) system. Planning for the system, a component of the OC-MEDS Project began over two years ago and was funded in part by the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) and the Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP). The first of its kind in California, the system has been designed to be interoperable with the existing electronic Prehospital Care Reports (ePCR) used by most 9-1-1 EMS providers throughout the county and has been integrated into the Base Hospital Radio Consoles used by Mobile Intensive Care Nurses (MICN) during online medical control.

An eBHR pilot program was launched at Hoag Hospital – Newport Beach in February 2014. The pilot has gone well and will be expanded to St. Jude Medical Center in May 2014. OCEMS anticipates that all Base Hospitals will be "live" on the eBHR by late Summer / early Fall 2014.

The OC-MEDS Licensure and Certification System has been configured to allow applications for 9-1-1 Paramedic, IFT-ALS Paramedic, and AeroMedical Paramedic Accreditation.

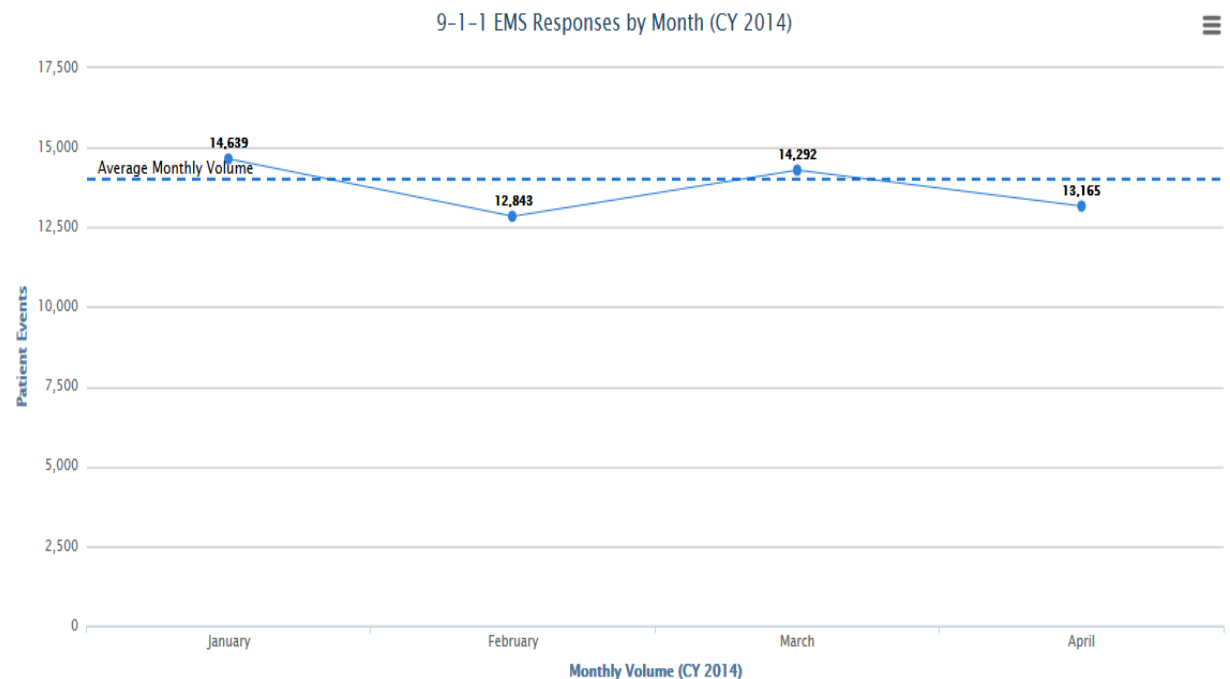

New Format and Quarterly System Reports are on the Horizon; Newsletter to be Retired

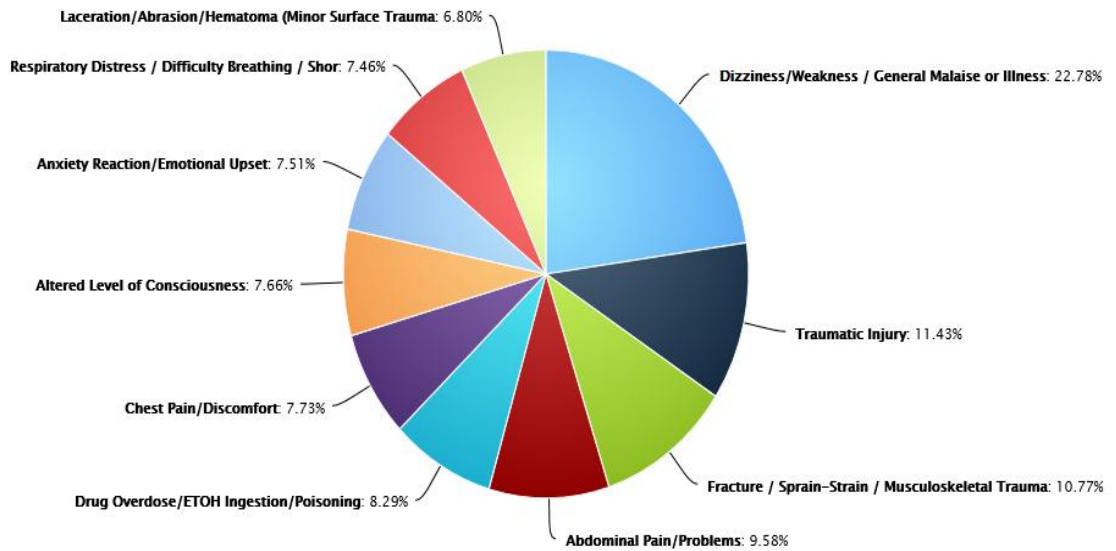

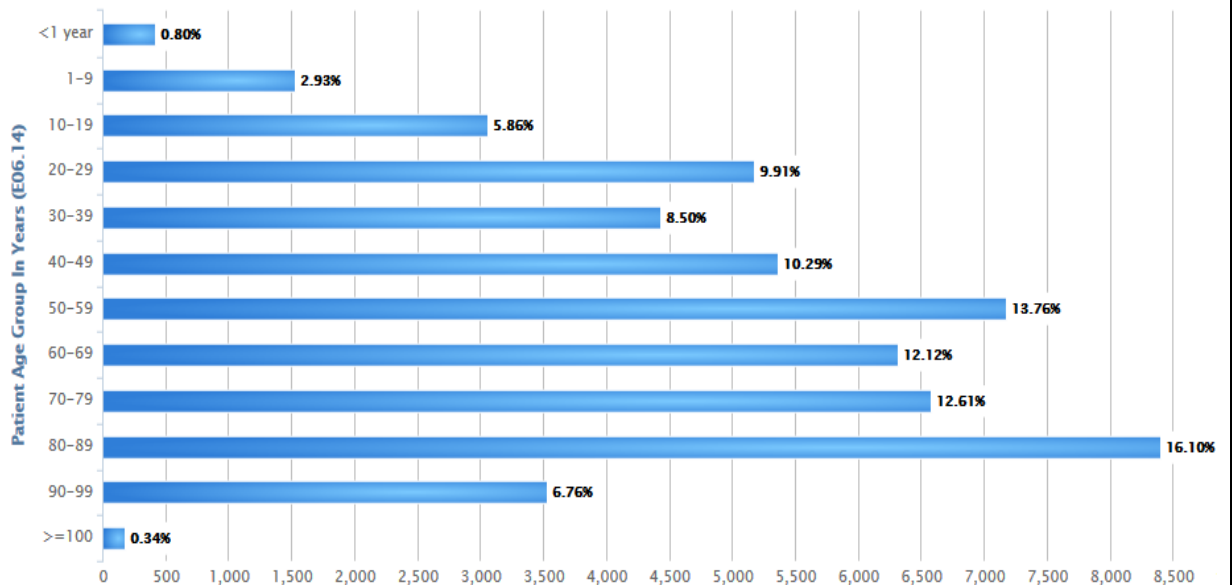
