Nitrate & Nitrite Monitoring Requirements Not Met for Caspers Regional Wilderness Park During 2017

Our water system recently failed to monitor as required for a drinking water standard during 2017 and, therefore, was in violation of the regulations. Although this is not an emergency, as our visitors, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we did to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During 2017, we did not collect a sample for nitrate and nitrite from Well 02 and therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What should I do?

- There is nothing you need to do at this time.
- The table below lists the contaminant we did not properly test for during the calendar year 2017, how many samples we are required to take and how often, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were taken.

Contaminant	Required Sampling Frequency	Number of Samples Taken	When All Samples Should Have Been Taken	When Samples Were Taken
Nitrate	One sample annually from Well 02	None	During 2017	02/12/2018 08/27/2018
Nitrite	One sample every three (3) years from Well 02	None	During 2017	09/19/2018

- If you have health issues concerning the consumption of this water, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What happened? What is being done?

Nitrate and nitrite sampling of our water system did not occur during 2017. We have since taken the required samples, as described in the last column of the table above. The samples

showed we are meeting drinking water standards. Drinking water standards for nitrate and nitrite have been met since Well 02 was constructed in 1999.

Steps have been taken to ensure timely sampling of nitrate and nitrite from Well 02 in the future.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this public notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.

Secondary Notification Requirements

Upon receipt of notification from a person operating a public water system, the following notification must be given within 10 days [Health and Safety Code Section 116450(g)]:

- **SCHOOLS:** Must notify school employees, students, and parents (if the students are minors).
- **RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS OR MANAGERS** (including nursing homes and care facilities): Must notify tenants.
- **BUSINESS PROPERTY OWNERS, MANAGERS, OR OPERATORS:** Must notify employees of businesses located on the property.

This notice is being sent to you by Caspers Regional Wilderness Park in compliance with the California Domestic Water Quality and Monitoring Regulations as a means of keeping the public informed.
