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Newport Dunes Waterfront Resort

The resort, operated by a County lessee, offers a great quiet-water swimming lagoon.

Bayside Beach

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This small bayfront beach offers quiet water that's perfect for swimming. No lifeguard is on duty, and there is limited parking in the adjacent Harbor Patrol lot.

Salt Creek Beach/Bluff Park

Salt Creek is one of Orange County's top surfing beaches. A small, offshore reef creates some of the best left breaks along the entire shoreline. Swimming, body surfing, sunbathing and exploring seasonal tidepools are other activities here. A concessionaire offers food, beverages and beach supplies. Weddings can be held with advance reservations.

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Strands Beach at Salt Creek

Pacific Coast Highway and Selva Road Dana Point 5:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. 949-923-2280

Enjoy swimming, surfing or looking for seasonal tidepools along Strands Beach at Salt Creek. Restrooms and showers are available along with free parking in the lot off Selva Road.



Dana Point Harbor

(Adjacent to Dana Point Harbor Drive)

A park with grassy area, picnic tables and barbeques is located across from Baby Beach, a quiet water beach perfect for little swimmers. Special events can be held with advance registration at OC Sailing and Events Center. Please call 949-923-2215 for more information.

(Approximately 2 miles south of Dana Point Harbor, at Pacific Coast Highway and Beach Road.)

Enjoy swimming, body surfing and fishing at this beach located beneath the Capistrano bluffs.

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Poche Beach

Poche Beach is a small beach along the south county coastline. No restrooms are available, and parking is along Camino Capistrano.
