B. UPCOMING OC PARKS EVENTS

<u>Wilderness Access Day: Gypsum Canyon Wilderness – March 9 – 8 a.m. – 2 p.m.</u>

• Come explore OC Parks' newest trails at Gypsum Canyon Wilderness through this self-guided opportunity. Located within OC Parks' Irvine Ranch Open Space, Gypsum Canyon Wilderness features 6 miles of new trails for hiking, mountain biking and horseback riding. Two lookout points offer sweeping views of the surrounding canyons and unique prehistoric rock formations, while seven new trails provide multiple loop options that vary in distance and range from easy to moderate in difficulty. Visitors will have the opportunity to provide voluntary feedback about Gypsum Canyon Wilderness through on-site participation surveys and offer naming suggestions for several unnamed trails.

Birding by the Creek – Aliso and Wood Canyons Wilderness Park – March 16 – 8 – 10:30 a.m.

 Aliso Creek is one of the best riparian birding sites in Orange County and gives access for a lovely morning hike. OC Parks staff and

Biking the Bay – Upper Newport Bay Nature Preserve – March 16 – 9:30 a.m. – 12 p.m.

 Join OC Parks for an interpretive bike ride around Upper Newport Bay! Participants will have the opportunity to get their heart rate up and pedal around the Bay, all while learning about local ecology and history. This moderately-paced ride will cover a 10-mile section of the Back Bay Loop Trail over the course of 2.5 hours. Pleasants Family

- Joseph and Mary Pleasants
 - Early pioneers of Orange County
 - Wave of settlers to West after Homestead Act
 - Mary was from prominent Carpenters and Refugios
 - Most notable beekeeper
 - County's first Bee Inspector 1902–1927
- Original cottage built onsite in 1874
- Stone House built in 1876
 - Stored supplies in hot summers and cool winters
 - Protected food from bears and other wildlife

Helena Modjeska

- Joseph Pleasants befriended Modjeska in Anaheim
 - She and her husband visited ranch many times
 - First introduction to canyons
- Mary Pleasants dies in 1888
 - Joseph Pleasants sells the property to the Modjeskas
 - Architect Stanford White is hired to design plans for cottage
 - Oldest known building west of the Mississippi River designed by Stanford White

SUBJECT: OC Parks Trails Subcommittee Members Term Extension
