
<u>Winter Bird Walk – Santiago Oaks Regional Park – Wednesday, February</u> 19, 7:30 – 9:30 a.m.



# Pleasants Family

- Joseph and Mary Pleasants
  - Early pioneers of Orange County
  - Wave of settlers to West after Homestead Act
  - Mary was from prominent Carpenters and Refugios
  - Most notable beekeeper
  - County's first Bee Inspector 1902–1927
- Original cottage built onsite in 1874
- Stone House built in 1876
  - Stored supplies in hot summers and cool winters
  - Protected food from bears and other wildlife

# Helena Modjeska

- Joseph Pleasants befriended Modjeska in Anaheim
  - She and her husband visited ranch many times
  - First introduction to canyons
- Mary Pleasants dies in 1888
  - Joseph Pleasants sells the property to the Modjeskas
  - Architect Stanford White is hired to design plans for cottage
  - Oldest known building west of the Mississippi River designed by Stanford White






- First floor completed in 2007

Before first floor restoration




After first floor restoration










Renewals

### OC Parks Trails Subcommittee Member Appointment

On April 7, 2016, the Orange County Parks Commission ("Commission") voted to approve the creation of the Orange County Parks Trails Subcommittee ("Subcommittee"). Pursuant to the Subcommittee's Guidelines, the Subcommittee shall consist of seven regular members appointed by the Commission. Two of the members consist of Commission members, appointed by the Commission, who serve the Chairperson and Alternate Chairperson of the Subcommittee. The remaining five members of the Subcommittee consist of members of the community based upon a review of applications of individuals with involvement and expertise in trails and bikeways. There is a desire to establish a subcommittee that provides a balanced representation from various geographic areas of the county, as well as the various trail user groups (pedestrians/hikers, equestrians, mountain bikers, road cyclists) and environmental organizations.

The Subcommittee is currently comprised of two members who represent hikers, one who represents bikers, and one who represents hikers, bikers, and equestrians, in addition to two Commission representatives — Chair Shawver and Commissioner Jones, serving as Chair and Alternate Chair of the Subcommittee, respectively.

Recently, a Subcommittee member resigned who primarily represented equestrians but also hikers and cyclists. Following this member's resignation, OC Parks staff, Chair Shawver, and Commissioner Jones reviewed applications of individuals with hiking, cycling, or equestrian interests and selected a candidate for consideration by the Commission to fill the vacant Subcommittee seat.

Ms. Gibran Stout is an equestrian and is actively involved in the OC Equestrian Vaulting and Las Vaqueras Riding Club. She has expressed concern about the impact of urbanization on trail access, which aligns with the Subcommittee's consideration of environmentally sensitive conditions and trails. Additional information on Ms. Stout is provided in the application attached to this staff report. Appointment of Ms. Stout would support a balanced representation of the various trail user groups and provide additional insight on environmental issues.

### OC Parks Trails Subcommittee Membership Renewals

On March 2, 2023, the Commission appointed David Browning and Michael Schoeck to serve as members of the OC Parks Trails Subcommittee for two-year terms, consistent with the Commission-approved Subcommittee Guidelines. Members Browning and

Schoeck's terms are due for renewal, and they have both expressed interest in continuing their service on the Subcommittee.

Member Browning is a mountain biker. He has experience with various mountain biking groups, including as the founder of thinkMTB and president of OCMTBA. Renewal of Member Browning's membership on the Subcommittee would support a balanced representation of the various trail user groups, and the Subcommittee would benefit from Member Browning's prior Subcommittee experience.

Member Schoeck is a hiker and trail runner. He is a member of several local hiking and trail running groups and is interested in preserving and protecting the land and educating the public. Renewal of Member Schoeck's membership on the Subcommittee would support a balanced representation of the various trail user groups and the Subcommittee would benefit from Member Shoeck's prior Subcommittee experience.

### **RECOMMENDED ACTION(S):**

- 1. Appoint Gibran Stout as a member of the OC Parks Trails Subcommittee for a two-year term, expiring on March 6, 2027.
- 2. Renew the membership of OC Parks Trails Subcommittee Member David Browning for an additional two-year term, expiring on March 6, 2027.
- 3. Renew the membership of OC Parks Trails Subcommittee Member Michael Schoeck for an additional two-year term, expiring on March 6, 2027.
