Arden: Helena Modjeska Historic House and Gardens

Tucked away amidst a
live oak grove on the
banks of Santiago Creek
in Modjeska Canyon lies
the century-old home
of world-renowned
actress Madame Helena
Modjeska. Named for the
grounds' resemblance
to the Forest of Arden in the
Shakespearean play, "As You
Like It," Arden is designated a
National Historic Landmark.

THE LIFE OF ARDEN.

Around 1873, Orange County homesteader Joseph Pleasants built a small cottage on what is now known as the Arden property. Over the next several decades, the original cottage received new additions, including a dining room and screened porch. From 1888 to 1906, Helena Modjeska and Count Bozenta hosted many prominent visitors, including fellow actress Maud Durbin, famed pianist Ignacy Jan Paderewski and many more. In 1906, they sold their beloved Arden, moved briefly to Tustin then Newport Beach where Helena Modjeska died in 1909 at age 68.

THE BIRTH OF ARDEN.

Helena Modjeska's successful debut in San Francisco was soon followed by performances in New York, London and countless rural opera houses and small theaters across the United States. Over the next 30 years, she became one of America's most beloved actresses.

Returning to Orange County after nearly a decade on the road, Modjeska and her husband, Charles Bozenta Chlapowski, known as "Count Bozenta," bought a small ranch home in a shady canyon. They hired famed New York architect Stanford White to redesign the existing house into the picturesque residence we see today. The beauty of the surrounding oak groves reminded Modjeska of the Forest of Arden in the Shakespearean play, "As You Like It," prompting her to name the property "Arden."

A NATIONAL HISTORIC LANDMARK.

Over the years, Arden changed hands several times, but minimal alterations have occurred. In 1986, Arden was sold to the County of Orange for the purpose of establishing a historic park. On December 14, 1990, the National Park Service honored Helena Modjeska's beloved former home by designating it a National Historic Landmark, one of few that tell an immigrant woman's story. In 2023, OC Parks completed an extensive renovation of the Joseph Pleasants Stone Building, opening both floors to the public for the first time in park history.
