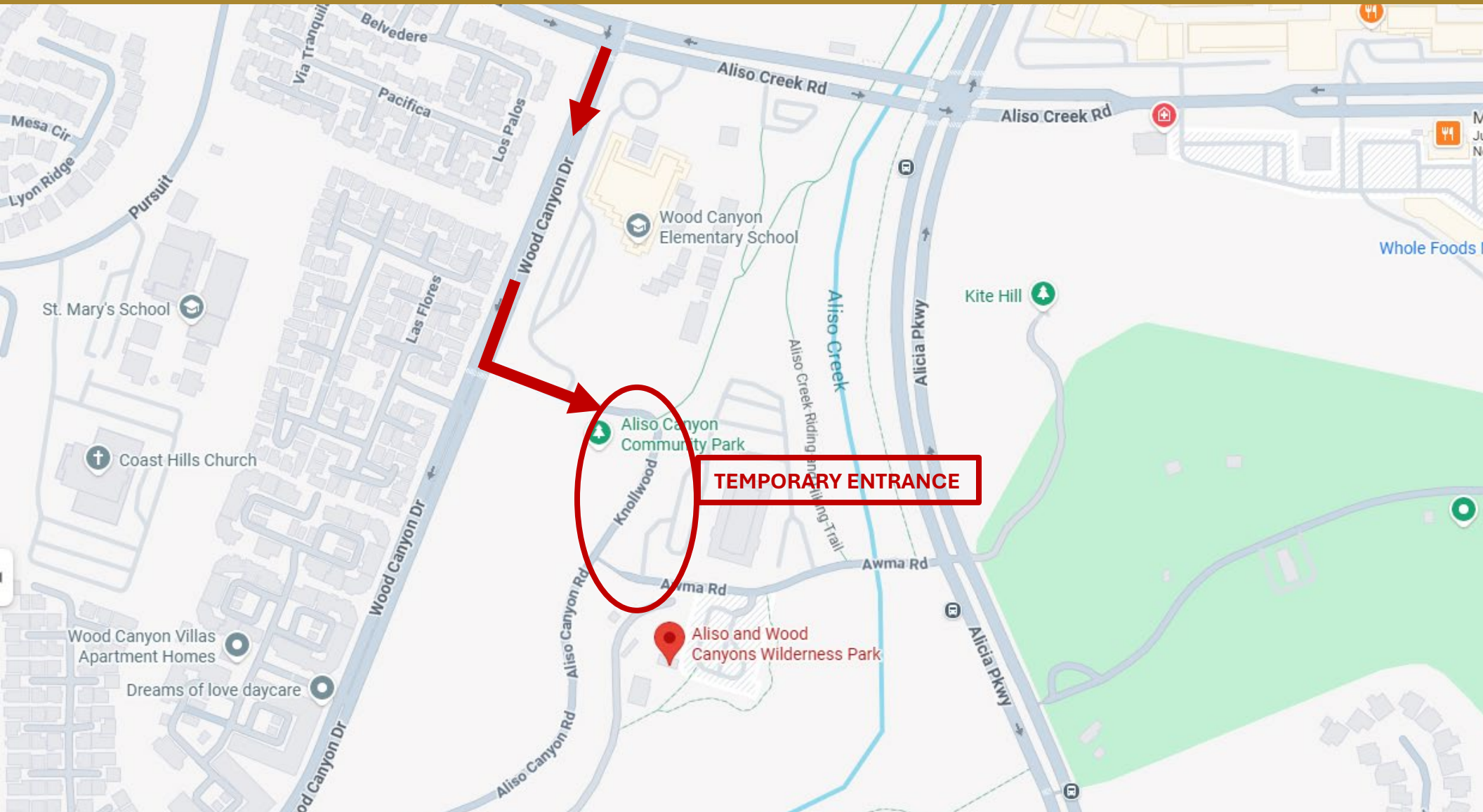
Vicinity Map
